- Read the Bible passages for the day ahead of the sermon- you can find these on the
 pewsheet. Being familiar with the text will be helpful as you listen to it being read and
 preached on. Take time to look around the texts in the Bible, because context can really
 help understanding. Ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you and everyone else through the
 readings and the sermon/talk. You can do all this before the service if you arrive early.
- 2. Read along as the readings are being read. Most churches have pew Bibles or a screen you can use for this.
- 3. Bring a notebook and pen/pencil to church with you and take notes during the sermon. The sermon is in the service because it is assumed the preacher has something worth saying! You can then refer back to the notes later.
- 4. Thank the preacher. Think of a sermon like you would a friend or relative making you a meal- you show appreciation for their effort on your behalf. Even if it doesn't turn out amazingly, most preachers spend literally hours preparing a sermon- praying, reading, reflecting, researching and writing. Clergy and LLMs spend years in training for this purpose!
- 5. Be prepared to offer constructive feedback. Often preachers have no idea how a sermon "lands"; a kind word can be incredibly encouraging. Likewise, if the preacher has confused or challenged you- or there's something else s/he needs to hear- it's good for them to know. Preachers want (or should want!) to improve.
- 6. Reflect on the sermon and readings after the sermon. Don't leave it in church.

Sermons have often been labelled as boring. They don't have to be, and whilst that may be down to the preacher, much rests on the hearer and the attitude they bring. The sermon is an opportunity to hear and learn from the Holy Spirit as he speaks through his ministers. As with much in life, if we are proactive, we will do better- in this case, built up in our faith. And of course, this is not solely a personal thing; as we grow spiritually, we will better serve our Lord, his church and our community all the more faithfully.
